Someone once said that "the church is meant for mission, as a fire is meant for burning". Thank you for being attentive to the flame in your own special way.

Our Lenten focus this year will be on "spiritual formation" and we are invited to join our friends at St. Andrews United Church for their mid-day Ash Wednesday Service (February 14th). 

WOW, and what a year it has been.

Another year in Emmanuel's spiritual and financial life has come and gone. Our search for a new minister came to fruition; and with Reverend Roni's arrival mid last year, there is hope for renewal and a brighter future for our congregation.

Although our givings to the General Fund were below our budget target, thanks to the hard work of our committees and volunteers we were able to finish the year with a small, but positive, surplus. We start 2018 with a very low bank balance. This is an unwelcome stressor for our Treasurer as even our creditors want to be paid.

Once again this year, the hard work of the many volunteers of our church community resulted in impressive returns; including, \$7,360 from our 49th Turkey Supper, \$6,600 from our 33rd Beef Supper, \$2,166 from our 8th Non-supper Supper and \$1,426 from our 8th Cookie Walk.

The UCW continues to be a hardworking and generous group. Their tireless hard work and exceptional financial contributions do not go unnoticed and are most appreciated.

A special thank you goes to all those who have designated givings to M&S. Your stewardship, kindness and generosity have resulted our meeting this important outreach target.

Your finance committee, in cooperation with various committees, has tried to prioritize capital enhancement projects in line with needs and available funding. We would like to do more but must remain good stewards of our financial health.

For 5 of the 12 months of 2017 (an improvement over 2016), monthly expenses exceeded revenue. If you are not on PAR, can we ask that you seriously consider enrolling? This will spread out your annual givings more evenly over the whole of the year.

PAR is a win-win program for all. Let us all target for revenue / expenditure neutral months throughout the year. It will help the Treasurer meet the monthly expense of Emmanuel without having to secure short term loans.

<u>Think of the added convenience of PAR</u> – no more looking for cash or your cheque book at the last moment. You can show up for service relaxed knowing you are in control and doing your part at being the best steward you can be.







EASY PASTA CASSEROLE

1 cup cooked meat: turkey, chicken, wieners, meatballs, etc. (cut into bite sized pieces) {optional}

½ cup frozen peas or other green vegetables {optional}

1 cup pasta (bows, macaroni, or shells)

1 small onion (coarsely chopped)

1 can condensed cream soup (mushroom, celery, or chicken)

1 can water

Dash of tabasco sauce

Add salt and pepper to taste

Spray casserole dish.

Pour condensed soup with one can of water into a casserole and mix. Add the other ingredients and mix well.

Place covered, into a preheated 350° F oven for 60 minutes or until pasta reaches desired texture.

Serve with side salad and roll.

Missions Committee of Presbytery Report

1. A call for Peace, Justice, and Reunification in the Korean Peninsula

Rev. Jon Bok Kim prepared a paper and motion that calls on Presbytery and UCC to work with global partners for peace, justice, and reunification in the Korean peninsula, to advocate for importance of peace talks among the USA, China, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, and the Republic of Korea to replace the armistice of the Korean War with a peace treaty. This includes to seek the reconciliation and restoration of families and communities long divided by conflict and hostility, so that social, spiritual, and psychological healing can occur among the people of Korea. Finally, that the UCC develop worship and develop education resources for peace, justice, and reunification and call upon congregations to pray for peace with their peoples and churches.

2. Right Relations

A film "Truly and Humbly' about the General Council Apology to Indigenous peoples in 1986 was screened in St. Peter's Church, Sudbury Nov. 6th. The feedback from those who attended was heartfelt and positive. We are hoping that a showing will come to North Bay. You can download it from the internet free of charge. Sister Priscilla of the Mother house asked for a representative on the North Bay Reconciliation Committee, and Janie Clayton will be the representative.

3. Greening

Energy East Pipeline is gone. The issue of climate change is still critical and the UCC will be participating in a post card campaign to raise further awareness and concerns over Paris Acord and Climate change goals that are not being met.

An environmental film was shown at Emmanuel United church called "Before the Flood". Rev. Elizabeth Frazer presided. Bob Pronovost ran the projector.

4. Support for LGBT community in South Korea

A letter was written to express support and solidarity with the National Council of Churches in Korea as they support the South Korean LGBTQ community.

5. Youth and mental Health

We hope to invite Margi Clark from CMHA to help us discern what we might do to promote issues and solutions to Mental Health concerns in our community, especially involving youth.

We are also trying to get the JOY Band back this spring for a Sunday morning performance as well as other soloists and performers. We will also continue to get pulpit supply when the need arises. If you have a preference as to who you would like as pulpit supply when Rev. Roni is away, please let me know and I will attempt to get that person for you.

Our subcommittee, Memorial Sound Upgrade Committee, with members Phillip Carmichael (chair), Lorne Robertson, Bob Pronovost and Rev. Rick Thorne and myself have met and are trying to bring forward a plan to replace our 30 year old sound system. Some suggestions have already been received from the church committee chairs and others, which we appreciate. At this stage we do not know the cost or the features of the new system. Since this project is a Memorial Fund project of the Worship Committee we expect that there will be some financial needs for the Memorial Fund. If you have a desire to honour and remember some of your family or friends who have died, or if you would prefer a future donation, a gift to the Memorial Fund for this sound system, or other ways of beautifying the sanctuary, this would be appreciated by those of us today, and also those who attend our church in the future. Thank you for considering this Memorial.
