



One of the things that energizes me about Emmanuel United Church is a relatively clear mission statement: "Emmanuel United Church shall be a caring, welcoming faith community, nurturing spiritual life and sharing God's love and grace as experienced in Jesus Christ."

I appreciate the clear values expressed: caring, welcoming, spiritual nurturing, and sharing God's love. I celebrate that Jesus is included in the statement. I read it often and try to find ways to internalize the statement and to allow it to shape my heart and how I go about doing ministry in the community.

The building at 395 Lakeshore is a wonderful edifice that at best serves as a home base for mission. Now what if church was not a building, what if church was not something that we hope that others would join like a club, but a movement marked by love and grace, caring and sharing moving into our neighbourhoods, where we live out most of our week? What if God is already in the neighbourhood, working through the faithfulness of the people at Emmanuel? What if God is calling us to be more faithful neighbours? We value our buildings because it is our home base for mission; yet, what if church is a way of being in the world? The earliest Christians had this spiritual awareness, of church as movement, and we can have this in 2019.

Let's be honest. Mainline methods for growing vibrant churches haven't worked for some time. Building it is no guarantee that they will come. We are living in a different and dynamic time. There is almost nothing more exciting and challenging than teaming up with community to be a compelling expression of the presence of God in the neighbourhood. Visionaries, like Vivian Pentland, knew this - hence "Emmanuel Village".

So, if we are serious about real change, we need a spirit of experimentation; a powerful culture-shifting approach that grabs hold of the heart, realigns core desires and sparks collective imagination. At the same time our awareness of the Spirit deepens, and soon enough we join in with what God is doing right here in West Ferris. Before we know it, we are being church with the neighbours God has given us. God is in the neighbourhood and we need to join with God.

As our visibility increases and our partnerships deepen, we become attractive and more stewards and new leaders may even step up - this by the way is all consistent with our strategic plan which Council passed this past March.

One Perspective—"This is May 2019"



There are moments in life which we recall by events or words. "This is 2015" recalls a Prime Minister's beginning of his term, "Ask not what your country can do for you - what can you do for your country" resonates from the early 1960's.

Attendees at Emmanuel's anniversary Sunday service heard a familiar expression "In the midst of everything" as our friend Rev. Gord Roberts took a moment and we recalled names of past members who created Emmanuel's church and pride. Their legacy continues; however, it needs to evolve in different ways if Emmanuel is to grow and prosper.

"This is May 2019" promises to be a pivotal time in the life of our church. Strategies to grow and be more relevant to more people will evolve (May 25 - 26 weekend). A critical consideration will be the "means" to achieve those "ways". Emmanuel will be challenged as our cupboard (\$) is depleted to a point that is stressful.

Our May "\$ and Sense" identified a significant decline of \$3,460. in our offerings to date. Many factors affected church attendance in 2019. An analysis of the past 3 years yielded that use of envelopes was 4 less while families sustaining our church through PAR was only 1 less than average. Our situation was compounded as property costs (snow, hydro) were \$1,513. greater than previous year. The good news was that both the Beef Supper and the Non-Supper Supper exceeded expectation, and "Gift Cards' generated \$398. in new revenue."

The May 8th Finance meeting was a pleasant revelation. Five (83%) took time from busy schedules and were joined by a guest and Rev. Roni. During the 1 1/2 hour meeting the Chair noted their youth and commitment to offer skills and aptitudes; but, more particularly, their empathy for those we serve. Emmanuel's plight may be stressful but there is a willingness to support "champions" of growth initiatives.

There are 145 families on Emmanuel's congregation list. Collectively, the "time" and "talent" of <u>all</u> Emmanuel's families can overcome the challenge; and, in the process replenish our "treasures". We are grateful for the efforts of the past members mentioned and others who continue to sustain their/our legacy. How will we evolve?

Shelter at our door - Easy Access for all North Bay

North Bay Transit has relocated "our" bus stop and the new solar powered panel is being assembled. North Bay's buses are fully accessible, accommodating up to 2 wheelchairs, and "kneel" to allow passengers to get on and off with ease."

The new shelter location will make it even more convenient for people to use North Bay Transit to attend and participate in events at Emmanuel.

There will be shelter at our door and shelter at both bus stops on the

other side of Lakeshore Drive. The bus stop shelters for northbound travel are at the Metro driveway or just beyond

"Timmies" where one can cross at a signalized intersection.

Buses from downtown North Bay do arrive at Emmanuel at 9:40 a.m. (Marshall Park) and 10:15 a.m. (Junction) on Sundays when there is 1 hour between buses.
The return Junction



bus would be at 12:35 p.m. or one could board Marshall Park bus at the Emmanuel shelter. Travellers from the south can be served by the Junction bus arriving at 9:35 a.m. and returning 12:15 pm

The new shelter location was at the request of the **Board of Emmanuel** Village. It alleviates safety concerns with the previous bus stop location and allows planned signage, complementing the church's free standing sign. This is another example of the neighbourly relationship that has existed since both were constructed as part of Emmanuel's "Village".




