#### **Contract Cleaner required for Emmanuel**

Emmanuel United Church is seeking a contract cleaner for 2 hours each week to do the following duties:

Clean the Washrooms

Vacuum and sweep the hallway and entrances

Vacuum the main areas of the Sanctuary and dust altar

Wipe high-touch surfaces (lights switches, door handles, etc.) and set the garbage out

Fridays are the preferred cleaning day but this is flexible.

Other duties may be requested from time to time at the applicable rate.

#### Sexton (Custodian for Weddings and Funerals)

Emmanuel United Church is seeking a Church Sexton to assist the minister with Weddings and Funerals. Be responsible to open church 1 hr. prior to service and secure the premises following the service. As a representative of Emmanuel United Church, dress in a manner befitting the occasion

- *A)* The duties of the Sexton can be performed by either a Male or a Female.
- B) The Sexton should have 'broad' knowledge of the church
  - a. where things are located
  - b. what may, or may not, be allowed in the church
- C) The Sexton will have a key to the church as he or she will be required to be there to clean and set up necessities before others arrive.
- D) The Sexton may also need to accept and place Floral Arrangements that may arrive prior to the ceremony.
- E) The Sexton also may be required to set up the Guest Registry (when applicable) in an accessible area.

When applicable, there should be a 'dedicated' person to take 'In Memoriam' donations and issue a temporary receipt.

An honorarium of \$75.00, set by Church Council, is provided for this role. The honorarium is part of the fee-for-service.


