Health Unit Protocol Updates

Talked to the Health Unit and they were very on top of the latest health protocols for Covid. Our committee has worked to keep on top of the changes as well.

In our Sanctuary, we are allowed to seat people close together with masks if we ask for vaccine passports. Otherwise, we will need to keep the current distances in seating and wear our masks. We recommend that we keep the current protocols (no passports) as some people may not be comfortable yet with close seating. Holding hands or arms for the last hymn will be discouraged for now.

We are allowed to have coffee fellowship with masks on when we are walking around, and distances kept. Sitting down, we were told that there are no distance requirements and masks may be removed for eating and drinking. We recommend that we use the small tables for a maximum of four people per table (within the individual comfort zone of sharing). The timing will depend on help for Congregational Life and Work Committee. Please contact Bud McMartin if you wish to help.

Rental Rates and Application Updated:

We have weekly or monthly rentals to outside groups, notably:

- Near North Quilter's Guild
- AL-ANON
- Victoria Quilts
- One time use meetings
- North Bay Astronomy Club
- Full-time Rental to Susan Whitehead of Canadian Shield Regional Council of small office

The Rental Rate structure and Rental Application Forms were presented to Council for approval and accepted.

Rental Rates Updated:

- 1. Research into the rates charged by St. Andrews and Trinity was brought to committee. A discussion was held on the current EUC and suggested revised rates that are harmonized with the other 2 UCC North Bay Churches.
- 2. All Renters shall complete a Rental Application. Emmanuel Church is named as co-insured for outside renters and an insurance certificate included with application. They also accept responsibility for signee to follow all covid guidelines including vaccination and mask policies.
- 3. Rental requests can be made through the church secretary or church office, and they will be forwarded to property designate or alternate. Rental fees will be paid though the church office.
- 4. Property will approve ALL rental applications. The approval authority is Property Merlin or his approved alternate.
- 5. Emmanuel Members should pay a rental fee for private functions they are holding.
- 6. To avoid possible double booking, a single booking calendar shall be maintained by Property.
- 7. A Rental folder will be maintained in the filing cabinet, top drawer, Emmanuel Church Office.

Cleaning: We are happy to announce that we have a new part time cleaner, Andy Trudell, who resides at Emmanuel Village and comes highly recommended.

First a poster was given to Emmanuel Village and Water's Edge that gives notice of the initiative. Any committee member may take the book out at random, when attending the church, and give notice while writing the details in the book. This was shared with Carl, Chair of Property.
