A Message From Rev. Roni

We live in chaotic uncertain times! This is indeed not news! I am confident that most, if not all of you are taking seriously the guidelines of the Provincial government and are staying home as much as possible. We are hoping that the case counts decrease and we are praying for a safe and non-violent transition of power in the USA. Jesus also lived with a high degree of chaos and uncertainty in first century Palestine, under an oppressive Roman regime and local government that mimicked the dominant oppressive culture. Jesus had very little social capital as the son of a woman who was pregnant before marriage, from an obscure village called Nazareth and from a family origin who survived on subsistence farming and limited wages from a home-operated carpentry business. Jesus didn't have much power in his culture and would be viewed by the leaders of his day as insignificant. If he made controversial and threatening statements, he could easily be silenced. I wonder if Jesus ever hoped that some person, thing or event will come along giving that final feeling of inner well-being? I know that at times, I long for that event, or moment in time that brings that inner sense of well-being. Jesus experiences such a moment at his baptism.

Mark tells us that the heavens tear open, the Holy Spirit descends on him taking the form of a dove and Jesus hears these words lovingly spoken, conveying great intimacy, like that of a father to a son, or a mother to a child "You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased."

He hadn't done anything of significance at that time, his ministry had not yet begun, he simply came forward to receive the sign of baptism. He didn't have to work for it, he didn't have to earn it. It was a sign of God's favour and compassion and it extends to each one of us

In our context, we understand baptism as a sign of belonging into God's family. God's words "You are my Beloved" reveal the most intimate truth about all human beings, whether they belong to any particular tradition or not. I don't think you need to be a Christian to belong, Being Beloved is God's personal affirmation of each one of us. Each one of us, through grace are endearingly named God's compassionate choice-God's Beloved. The affirmation is also God's call to us.

It also comes with responsibility, "from the moment we claim the truth of being beloved, we are faced with the call to become who we are. Becoming beloved community is the great spiritual journey we have to make."
