### A Message From Rev. Roni

#### Dear Friends,

I have been reading Desmond Cole's "The Skin You're In" as preparation for a book study which the North Bay Mission Cluster would offer over the next few months. I think it also bears relevance to this week's gospel reading. The book was written in the year 2017 and for reach month, the author documents an experience of racism and skillfully illustrates how the story relates to Canada's history of Black racism. In essence, he calls out racism. In our gospel reading, Jesus calls out evil. He calls out a demon to leave a person's body. Similarly, through our voices and witness, Jesus calls out systemic evil. The text illustrates that calling out injustice can create a little discomfort, even a stir. The biblical text goes further by making it clear that the man who was oppressed was restored.

The power of Jesus is revealed in his authority to restore life. The man who was once oppressed and disenfranchised now is confident of his original status "God's Beloved". The man's dignity and worth is restored.

I agree with Desmond Cole that we need to call out racism and understand its history. We also need to take an additional step of discerning a vision of Beloved community and live into it. At the onset of the Gospel of Mark, Jesus announces that the kingdom of God (Beloved Community) is at hand and everywhere Jesus went people saw it appearing. Don't we all long for it appearing? Calling out is step one. Jesus offers a vision for healing. What is that vision of healing for a racially just world? Let's discern together. #### **Become the Beloved**

As long as "being the Beloved" is little more than a beautiful thought or a lofty idea that hangs above my life to keep me from becoming depressed, nothing really changes. What is required is to become the Beloved in the commonplaces of my daily existence, and bit by bit to close the gap that exists between what I know myself to be and the countless realities of everyday life.
