### A Message From Rev. Roni

I once read that the opposite of joy is not sadness. The opposite of joy is fear. I think this is certainly true for Jesus's disciples. You will recall that after Jesus died they locked themselves in a room, out of fear. They were terrified, confused and they didn't believe the women's testimony about the Risen Lord. Forty days later, when Jesus ascends from the earth (Luke provides no details) their fears are transformed and they feel great joy.

What happened in between? They spent time with Jesus. Jesus revealed to them the meaning of the scriptures and how the law and prophets testified to his coming and his ministry on earth. The pieces finally fit. They were fed! They were fed much more than loaves and fishes, they were spiritually fed. Bodies, minds and spirits were fed. I wonder if our time away from the building and routine of doing church, is meant to be a time of

renewal? Are we intentionally choosing to be fed?

What feeds your spirit? What is strengthening and sustaining your spirit right now? I've been dedicating more time to prayer, play, self-care and caring for others.

A common theme in the gospels are that the disciples never truly get what Jesus is doing. At the time of the ascension, they finally get it. I hope we get it, we get a clearer vision of who we are meant to be, when this time of waiting is over. We now know that we don't need a building to be a church.
