A Note From Rev. Roni

I recently started watching the Netflix TV series "When Calls the heart", and in episode two the widows of a group of miners, all men, had perished in a mine explosion. While grief is still fresh in their hearts, they receive eviction

notices. Along with their children, they must leave the company homes provided, in order to make room for the new miner families, because the work must go on. They are poor, they are afflicted, they have each Other and the thought of being further uprooted is distressing for everyone.

So they make a costly sacrifice. These widows offer up themselves to work in the mines! It is a daunting task, they are risking their lives and scared out of their minds but for the love of their children, and the desire to be community for each other, they are resolved to complete the task. In their weakest moment, when they waiver, all of

the townswomen join in, along with a few men and they are able to complete the work and stay in their homes. At great cost, they restore their households.

In this week's gospel, we once more encounter Mary, Martha, and Lazarus, who live in a town called Bethany, meaning the house of the afflicted; this is where Jesus and his disciples are feasting before entering Jerusalem, for the last time. Everyone senses that this is likely. Jesus's final visit and we can imagine, they are feeling gratitude and a sense of sadness. Followers are expressing devotion and dissent. Mary moved by emotion, expresses a costly action of devotion. Costly at so many levels, she breaks the seal on this bottle of essential oil, pure nard, which no one in Bethany can afford.

She pours the entire content on Jesus's feet, drenching his feet, massaging the oil into his skin, the sweet aroma filling the air, and as if she and Jesus is alone in the room, she wipes the excess with her hair. Her actions are off-putting.

Everyone is astounded. The disciples, question the practicality of this act. Jesus acknowledges her gift of costly sacrifice, as one that points to the outpouring of his costly sacrifice for the sake of the world.

At great cost, Jesus restores the household of God. The aroma of grace lingers, touching our lives, bringing healing. Mary's devotion is a sign of God's devotion toward us.
