Paraphrase Acts 2: 41-42, 44-47

So those who welcomed Peter's proclamation of the Risen Christ were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved. I am grateful for the description of being church in the above text, and similarly grateful for all the "ing" ways that Emmanuel strives to be:

caring, welcoming, sharing, (spiritual) nurturing and I am hopeful that our capacity to share the love and grace of Jesus Christ will continue to grow, expand and include. This Vision Weekend, I will be praying for you and my hope is that most of you might emerge with a vision of church, as a way of be-ing community, with faith in the Risen Christ as our centre and the neighbourhood where he dwells.
